To Create a Nonpartisan Procedure for the Preparation of Legislative and Congressional Redistricting Plans

i. To the Honorable members of the Burnett County Board of Supervisors: 2 WHEREAS, currently under the state constitution, the legislature is directed to redistrict 3 4 legislative districts according to the number of inhabitants at its next session following the 5 decennial federal census by the majority party; and at the same intervals, the legislature also 6 reapportions congressional districts pursuant to federal law, and 7 8 WHEREAS. legislative and congressional redistricting plans enacted pursuant to this 9 procedure are used to elect members of the legislature and members of Congress in the fall of the second year following the year of the census; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, historically legislative and congressional plans in Wisconsin have been subject to partisan influence that put the desires of politicians ahead of the electoral prerogative of the 13 14 people; and 15 WHEREAS, the 2011 process to draw the maps and fight litigation contesting those maps cost 16 17 taxpayers nearly \$1.9 million; and 18 19 WHEREAS, a panel of federal district court judges has ruled that the redistricting that was 20 done in Wisconsin in 2011 was unconstitutional; and 21 22 WHEREAS, redistricting to achieve partisan gains is improper, whether it is done by 23 Republicans or Democrats. 24 25 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Burnett County Board of Supervisors insists 26 upon the creation of a nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and congressional 27 redistricting plans; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the process promotes more accountability and transparency and prohibits the consideration of voting patterns party information, and incumbents' 30 31 residence information or demographic information in drawing the maps, except as necessary to 32 ensure minority participation as required by the U.S. Constitution; and 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this 35 resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association, the 36 Wisconsin Towns Association, the Wisconsin League of Municipalities, all members of the 37 state legislature representing Burnett County and to each Wisconsin County. 38

WHEREAS,	Free and fair	elections	are essentia	lo	democracy	and	effective	self-	governance

WHEREAS, The appearance of buying access to candidates or influencing policy, governance, and judicial decisions because of large outsider donations erodes voter confidence in our elections and democracy; and

WHEREAS, The County of Door has an interest in protecting itself and its clizens against intrusions on local control by mitigating the influence of money and privileged access in state and federal government and elections; and

WHEREAS, The U.S. Supreme Court's decisions in Citizens United and related cases allow unlimited spending by certain groups known as Super-PACs to influence local, state, and federal elections; and

WHEREAS, The above mentioned Supreme Court cases:

- have granted Corporations, Unions, non-profits, and other man-made entities (such as Super-PACs) the same Constitutional protections given only to individual human beings by the Framers of the Constitution, and;
- have declared money to be 'free speech'

WHEREAS, as of February 15, 2018, 78.9% of Door County municipalities (15/19) have called upon the Door County Board of Supervisors to support their Resolutions Supporting a Constitutional Amendment to Allow Limits on Campaign Contributions and Conducting a Non-Binding Statewide Referendum.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Door County Board of Supervisors (joining with the 120 Wisconsin communities to date, including 9 other counties) calls upon our elected State Assembly Representative and State Senator and on the Wisconsin State Legislature to hold a non-binding state-wide Referendum asking the voters if they wish the State of Wisconsin to support an Amendment to the United States Constitution stating:

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. <u>03</u> (2018/19)

Re: Supporting the Sheriff in Expanded Use of Electronic Monitoring to Alleviate Detention Center Space Shortage; Directing the Criminal Justice Advisory Committee to Study Alternatives to Incarceration; and Directing a Report on Long-term Options to Address Detention Center Space Needs

WHEREAS, the current adult inmate population at the Sheboygan County Detention Center is reaching the capacity for the facilities, and

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County is facing the prospect of housing its adult inmates at out-of-county facilities if our own facilities are not expanded and/or alternatives to incarceration are not utilized, and

WHEREAS, housing Sheboygan County adult inmates at out-of-county facilities would cost approximately \$50 to \$75 per day, per inmate, not including transportation expenses at a cost to Sheboygan County of approximately \$750,000 - \$1.1 Million per year based on 40 inmates, and

WHEREAS, ordinarily an inmate sentenced to jail with Huber Law (work release) privileges is released into the community for up to 12 hours each day without any supervision and then is incarcerated in the Detention Center for the balance of each day, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff has the statutory authority to allow inmates sentenced to jail with Huber Law privileges to be released on electronic monitoring devices wherein they are monitored 24 hours per day, and

WHEREAS, re-assigning Huber Law inmates to electronic monitoring would free up as many as 40 beds at the Detention Center for inmates sentenced to more significant crimes, and

WHEREAS, expanded use of the electronic monitoring option for Huber Law inmates on an interim basis would provide the County with a cost-effective option and would provide additional time for the County to consider alternatives to incarceration and assess and plan accordingly for an appropriately-sized addition to the Detention Center, and

WHEREAS, the Criminal Justice Advisory Committee was established by the County Board to provide guidance to the Law Committee on all criminal justice planning in order to maximize the efficiency and effectiveness of the entire system, and

WHEREAS, in 2017 the County Board anticipated the need for an expansion of the Detention Center facility by making it a component of the County's Five-year Capital Plan but has not determined the form which such expansion would take;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sheboygan County Board recognizes the Sheriff's statutory authority to place inmates sentenced under the Huber Law to electronic monitoring and supports expanded use of electronic monitoring options by the Sheriff as may be

necessary in order to provide additional space at the Sheboygan County Detention Center for more serious offenders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Criminal Justice Advisory Committee is directed to review the current incarceration facilities and the projected future needs for Sheboygan County and evaluate potential alternatives to incarceration including exploring what seems to be working for other communities and submit a written report of recommendations to the Law Committee by January 2019.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sheriff and Law Committee, together with the County Administrator, Health and Human Services Director, and Finance Director, are directed to continue to assess the demands and trends involving the Detention Center, to identify opportunities for modification or improvement, to explore alternatives, and by May 2019 provide a written proposal on expansion of the Sheboygan County Detention Center for the County Board's consideration.
