Re: Amending Shoreland Ordinance in SW 1/4, SE 1/4, and SE 1/4, SE 1/4, Section 34, Town of Mosel (3,000 Square Feet of Property – Construction of a Driveway Associated with a Proposed Chapel on the Bluff of Lake Michigan)

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County wishes to rezone 3,000 square feet of wetlands located in the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 and SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 34, Township 16 North, Range 23 East, Town of Mosel from "Shoreland-Wetland District" to "Shoreland District" to allow for the construction of a driveway associated with a proposed chapel on the bluff of Lake Michigan, and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Shoreland Ordinance (Chapter 72, Sheboygan County Code), the required procedural steps have been properly completed and the public hearing held, and

WHEREAS, this Committee concludes that the public interest will be served by enactment of this Ordinance in that conservation and environmental protection interests will be carefully honored and monitored;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisor of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, Kohler Co., a current user and hangar leaseholder at the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport, as well as other users and hangar leaseholders, feel that having a "user fee" designation for customs service would be useful for global Airport use, and

WHEREAS, the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport is eligible for designation as a "user fee" airport whereby the expense of the customs officers or employees in accepting entries of merchandise, clearing passengers, collecting duties, and enforcing the various provisions of customs and related laws would be borne by Sheboygan County and passed through to Kohler Co. through a Funding Agreement, a copy of which is on file in the County Clerk's Office, and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security is in the process of designating the Airport as a "user fee" airport allowing for customs services, subject to final approvals and the entering into of a Memorandum of Agreement between the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, and Sheboygan County, a template of which is on file in the County Clerk's Office, and

WHEREAS, it is projected that the first year's cost of the U.S. Customs officer will be \$140,874 and the cost of succeeding years will be \$123,438 subject to adjustment for wage increases, and

WHEREAS, the construction of a facility for U.S. Customs services is part of the County's five-year capital plan, and

WHEREAS, having a "user fee" designation for the Airport and the U.S. Customs services would have positive economic benefits to Sheboygan County and its citizens through increased Airport fuel sales and tourism activity such as the Ryder Cup in 2020 and Road America, as well as an option for commercial use for local businesses;

NOW. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Sheboygan County enter into a contract drafted to the satisfaction of the Corporation Counsel and approved by the Executive Committee providing that Kohler Co. pay the expenses associated with staffing of the U.S. Customs facility at the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the satisfactory entry into the Agreement with Kohler Co. committing them to pay such expenses, Sheboygan County enter a Memorandum of Agreement with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Customs and Border Protection, for the designation of the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport as a "user fee" airport, to enter into any lease agreement for such customs use, and to take such other actions as are necessary to accomplish this designation.

Resolution No. 2 (2019/20) RE: Designating the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport as a U.S. Customs Service "User Fee" Airport and Entering into an Agreement with Kohler Co. for Funding

This resolution, if adopted, provides the authority for the Sheboygan County Memorial Airport to be designated as a U.S. Customs and Border Facility. This authority to move into a Memorandum of Understanding with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and U.S. Customs and Border Protection is contingent on the execution of a contract with the Kohler Company for the Kohler Company to pay for the operating expenses and salaries associated with the maintaining of the Customs and Border Facility. These costs are estimated to be around \$140,874 for salaries and \$21,652 for data processing costs in the first year. In addition to these direct charges from the Customs and Border Protection, the Kohler Company would also be responsible for the utility expenses at the new facility. The proposed contract with the Kohler Company will ensure that the County would not bear the burden of salary or operational costs for the Customs Facility throughout the term of the contract which is drafted to be effective until December 31, 2050.

The County is responsible for the construction of the Customs Facility Building, which was approved by the County Board and included in the 2019 Five Year Capital Plan.

Funding:

No funding is required to adopt this resolution. Current funding for the responsibilities of the County associated with the Customs Facility Building has already been approved in the 2019 Five Year Capital Plan. The remaining funding for the construction of the Customs Facility will be introduced in the 2020 Five Year Capital Plan and will follow the normal approval processes for the 2020 Five Year Capital Plan. The estimates for the completion of the Facility are currently at \$3.7 million. This is lower than the \$5.5 million represented in the 2019 – 2023 Five Year Capital Plan.
