# JOURNAL OF THE MEETING OF THE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

# June 16, 2020

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.11, the June 16, 2020 session of the Sheboygan County Board was called to order by Chairperson Vern Koch at 6:04 p.m. Chairperson Koch noted that the notice of meeting was posted on June 12, 2020 at 2:30 p.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.
