CHILD SUPPORT QUARTERLY REPORT December 31, 2013

- 1. Attend child support staff and management meetings as available to explain new policy and processes, as well as overall agency operation and circuit court appearances.
- 2. Lien Docket as of December 31, 2013:

2013 Lien total 1,837 Cases

The lien-eligibility threshold is set at \$500. Sheboygan County has approximately 1803 cases which are eligible for liens. The following is a listing of other administrative enforcement tools which are automated through the lien docket per the D134 Report, dated December 31, 2013:

Staff are keeping up with various reports as most enforcement actions are automatic unless a payment plan is established.

3. As of December 31, 2013, our monthly performance targets and current standings are as follows:

4. The 2014 budget for Child Support has been developed. The Child Support Department was given \$0 in tax levy for 2014. The State is working on the funding we will have for 2014. The funding which we lost in 2011 has been replaced this year.

The kick-off for the 2014 budget process was held on June 26th. Child Support's tax levy will be zero in 2014 because our funding was put back by the State. Funding discussions for 2014 began between the State and Counties on April 10th and 11th. I will be attending these meetings as I am on the Contracts Committee and will be attending the Director's Dialogue. Additional meetings were held on May 9th, June 19th, July 16th and August 15th. A telephone conference call was set for September 12th with final distribution numbers due to counties by October 10th. Another report was sent out to the Contracts Committee on October 14th. The State is reviewing this report and should decide by January, 2014 the distribution of funding for each county.

5. The Private Fee Ordinance was approved at the October meeting of the County Board. We implemented this process April 1, 2013. This fee was included in our 2013 Budget. We have the approval of the Judges and Corporation Counsel to proceed with the Private Fee Ordinance.

At the present time, it appears that this is not working, as we must give each of our private cases one free service per the Judges and Corporation Counsel. We then charge the parties for the second request for service. We have sent out 9 invoices for payment. To date we have received one \$35 payment even though we sent information to 146 cases. We will be making calls regarding the 8 unpaid invoices and asking for payment or a payment plan. However, this process has resulted in 22 applications for service which does give us additional funding if they are good payers.

We will be reviewing these private fees early in 2014 and determine if it is beneficial to us or not. We will keep you informed.

Thank you for another opportunity to serve Sheboygan County. Per your request, I am pleased to provide the following proposal.

Parking Area PTZ Camera and Laundry Area Intercom Station Additions \$5,368.00 SGTS, Inc. shall provide one (1) Bosch Autodome 600 Series Exterior PTZ Video Surveillance Camera and one (1) Quam CIS Series Vandal-resistant Intercom Station for the existing Security Control System at the Sheboygan County Jail.

- The new Camera and all associated components, including wire, cable, raceway, back boxes, and mounting brackets shall be installed by Sheboygan County. Wire and cable shall be home-run from the desired camera location to Phase 2 Security Electronics room. Cabling requirements are as follows:
 - (1) West Penn 815 RG-59 Coaxial Cable with Copper Braided Shield
 - (1) West Penn D3651 2-pair Data Cable
 - (1) West Penn 224 18awg 2-conductor power cable.
- > The new Intercom Station and all associated components, including wire, cable, raceway, and back boxes, shall be installed by Sheboygan County. Wire and cable shall be home-run from the desired camera location to either the Phase1 Security Electronics room. Cabling requirements are as follows:
 - (1) West Penn 357 4-conductor cable (2 shielded and 2 unshielded)
- SGTS, Inc. shall provide head-end terminations and programming for both devices. Programming requires modification of the existing Telecor T3 Intercom, Bosch ViDos Video Surveillance, and WonderWare InTouch HMI Systems. Periods of down-time should be expected.

INCLUDES

SGTS, Inc. shall be responsible for the above listed scope, and the following:

- > All required materials.
- > All labor and expenses required for installation, configuration, testing, and drawing updates.
- All applicable taxes

EXCLUDES

SGTS, Inc. shall not be responsible for any item not specifically listed above, and the following.

Condition and operation of existing Video Surveillance and Recording System, including Encoders, Recorders, Power Supplies, and Monitoring Stations. Proposal assumes use of an existing spare encoder input. If available input can be found, Sheboygan County must provide an input in addition to this proposal.

- Condition and operation of the existing Intercom System including all existing Master Consoles, Controllers, and Termination Boards (TBUs). Proposal assumes use of an existing spare TBU port. If available port can be found, Sheboygan County must provide a port in addition to this proposal
- > Condition and availability of existing Security Control Network.
- Provision or installation of all 120Vac Line-voltage Circuits and Receptacles. No new circuits are anticipated. One receptacle is required for use by the new Camera Power Supply. UPS backup is strongly recommended.

Option 1: Laundry Area Intercom Station Addition

\$1,357.00

SGTS, Inc. shall provide one (1) Quam CIS Series Vandal-resistant Intercom Station for the existing Security Control System at the Sheboygan County Jail. This option includes the intercom station only. The above mentioned camera will not be provided.

Option 2: PTZ Camera Addition

\$4,641.00

SGTS, Inc. shall provide one (1) Bosch Autodome 600 Series Exterior PTZ Video Surveillance Camera for the existing Security Control System at the Sheboygan County Jail as described above. This option includes the camera only. The above mentioned intercom station will not be provided.
