JOURNAL OF THE MEETING OF THE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

October 25, 2016

Pursuant to Section 59.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the October 25, 2016 session of the Sheboygan County Board was called to order by Chairperson Thomas G. Wegner at 6:00 p.m. Chairperson Wegner noted that the notice of meeting was posted on October 21, 2016 at 10:30 a.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.

The roll call was taken and recorded with 23 Supervisors present; Absent: 2, Supervisors Bauer, and Van Dixhorn.

INITIAL PRESENTATION OF THE 2017 PROPOSED BUDGET

Mr. Payne presented the 2017 Proposed Sheboygan County Budget. The proposed 2017 budget decreases the property tax levy by 1% or \$500,000. The proposed property tax rate is \$5.65, a decrease of 2%, or 12 cents. The total budget of \$146 million supports 19 Departments, 820 employees administering over 200 programs and services. Mr. Payne reviewed key components of the budget, and thanked the County Board, Department Heads and staff for their efforts and excellent teamwork.

PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED BUDGET

Chairperson Wegner noted that the Notice of Public Hearing was published on October 4, 2016 and declared the public hearing on the proposed 2017 budget open for anyone wishing to be heard.

There being no persons wishing to be heard, Chairperson Wegner declared the public hearing closed at 6:21 p.m.

The Chairperson announced that the next order of business would be the review of the 2017 Proposed Budget and directed the County Clerk to go through the budget on a department by department basis. As each department was identified, the Chairperson requested that any amendments be offered.

When no further motions were offered, Chairperson Wegner declared the Budget Review Session concluded.

Supervisor Winkel made a motion to refer the budget back to the Finance Committee. Supervisor Weggeman seconded the motion which carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

The 2017 Proposed Budget was referred back to the Finance Committee.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 26 (2016/17)

Re: Approving Revisions to Farmland Preservation Plan

WHEREAS, a County Farmland Preservation Agreement is a component part of the County's development plan under Wis. Stat. § 59.69(3), and

WHEREAS, one of the requirements necessary to enable farmland owners to enter into farmland preservation agreements is that the County adopt a Farmland Preservation Plan which is certified by the State as being compliant with Chapter 91 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the Sheboygan County Planning & Conservation Department has developed a Farmland Preservation Plan for Sheboygan County which was adopted by the Sheboygan County Board of Supervisors on November 1, 2005, as Resolution No. 25 (2005/06) and was revised by Resolutions No. 23 (2013/14), No. 19 (2014/15), No. 15 (2015/16), and No. 21 (2016/17) which Plan and its revisions was certified by the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, and

WHEREAS, the Planning, Resources, Agriculture, and Extension Committee (PRAECom) has determined that the Plan requires revision of certain provisions in light of changes that were made to the Smart Growth Plan of the Town of Russell in order to remain consistent with the County's development plan and remain eligible for state certification;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sheboygan County Board hereby approves the revisions to the Sheboygan County Farmland Preservation Plan, in the manner reflected in the copy on file in the County Clerk's Office and made a part hereof by reference hereto and makes it a part of Sheboygan County's Development Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Planning & Conservation Director and Corporation Counsel be directed to undertake such further action as necessary to confirm the certification of the Plan.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. <u>07</u> (2016/17)

Re: Creating Property Assessed Clean Energy Financing (PACE) Ordinance

WHEREAS, the County Board adopted Resolution No. 13 (2016/17) on August 16, 2016, which authorized Sheboygan County to become a member of a Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Commission in order to provide real property owners, lessees, lenders, and other financial parties in Sheboygan County with access to a uniformly-administered program to provide PACE financing as authorized by Wis. Stat. § 60.0627(8), and

WHEREAS, in order to implement the authority provided in Resolution No. 13 (2016/17), it is necessary for Sheboygan County to enact an enabling Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Creating PACE Ordinance</u>. Chapter 8 of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances is hereby created as follows:

Chapter 8 PROPERTY ASSESSED CLEAN ENERGY (PACE) FINANCING

- 8.01 PURPOSE. Sheboygan County finds that renovations or additions to premises located in the County made to improve energy efficiency, improve water efficiency, and/or use renewable resource applications, increase property values, stimulate local economic activity, provide local and global environmental benefits, and promote the general welfare of County residents. The purpose of this Ordinance is to facilitate loans arranged by property owners or lessees to make such improvements by treating loan principal and interest, fees, and other charges as special charges eligible for inclusion on the tax roll for these properties.
- 8.02 DEFINITIONS. In this Chapter:
 - (1) Annual installment means the portion of the PACE loan that is due and payable for a particular year under the supplemental agreement.
 - (2) **Borrower** means the property owner or lessee of the subject property that borrows the proceeds on a PACE loan.
 - (3) **Default loan balance** means the outstanding balance, whether or not due, of a PACE loan at the time that the County receives foreclosure proceeds.
 - (4) **Foreclosure proceeds** mean the proceeds received by the County from the disposition of a subject property through an *in rem* property tax foreclosure.
 - (5) Loan amount means the principal, interest, administrative fees (including the Program Administrator's fees) and other loan charges to be paid by the borrower under the PACE loan.
 - (6) PACE means Property Assessed Clean Energy.

(7) PACE default provisions means:

- (a) The delinquent annual installment(s) due when the County initiates the *in rem* property tax foreclosure on the subject property;
- (b) Any additional annual installment(s) that become due between the time that the County initiates in rem property tax foreclosure on the subject property and the date the County receives the foreclosure proceeds.
- (c) Any default interest charges applied to unpaid annual installments referenced in Subsections (a) and (b), above, as provided in the supplemental agreement; and
- (d) Any default loan balance.
- (8) PACE lender means any person that makes a PACE loan and which may include an affiliate of the borrower.
- (9) PACE loan means a loan made by a PACE lender to a borrower under this Section for energy efficiency improvements, water efficiency improvements, or renewable resource applications made to or installed on a subject property.
- (10) **Person** means any individual, association, firm, corporation, partnership, limited liability company, trust, joint venture, or other legal entity or a political subdivision as defined in Wis. Stat. § 66.0627.
- (11) **Program Administrator** means the person retained by the Wisconsin PACE Commission as provided in Section 8.05(2).
- (12) Subject property means any premises located in the County on which an energy efficiency improvements, water efficiency improvements, or renewable resource applications are being or have been made and financed through an outstanding PACE loan.
- (13) Supplemental agreement means a written agreement among a borrower, a PACE lender, and the County as provided for in Section 8.07.
- (14) Wisconsin PACE Commission means the Wisconsin PACE Commission formed under Wis. Stat. § 66.0301, as may be amended, by the County and one or more other political subdivisions as defined in Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 pursuant to a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement relating to the Wisconsin PACE Commission as provided hereafter.
- 8.03 STATUTORY AUTHORITY. This Section is enacted pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 as may be amended which authorizes a county to make a loan or enter into an agreement regarding loan repayments to a third party for owner-arranged or lessee-arranged financing to an owner or a lessee of a premises located in the

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county for making or installing an energy efficiency improvement, a water efficiency improvement, or a renewable resource application to a premises..

8.04 PACE LOANS AS SPECIAL CHARGES; DELINQUENT AMOUNTS AS LIENS. Any PACE loan made and secured pursuant to this Chapter shall be considered a special charge on the subject property. Any installment or portion of a PACE loan made and secured pursuant to this Chapter that becomes delinquent according to the terms of the PACE loan shall be a lien against the subject property and placed on the tax roll as permitted pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 as may be amended.

8.05 WISCONSIN PACE COMMISSION.

- (1) In the event a Wisconsin PACE Commission is formed and Sheboygan County becomes originator of such PACE Commission and any Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement thereunder, any of the powers and duties of the County under this Chapter, except for those under Section 8.09, may (but are not required to) be delegated to the Wisconsin PACE Commission.
- (2) The Wisconsin PACE Commission shall further be authorized to retain a Program Administrator to act as its agent and administer the PACE program, subject to adherence with PACE program requirements consistent with this Chapter and Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 as may be amended.

8.06 LOAN APPROVAL.

- (1) A prospective borrower applying for a PACE loan shall comply with the loan application process set forth in the program manual approved by the County.
- (2) The County shall approve the financing arrangements between a borrower and PACE lender.

8.07 SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT.

- (1) The County, the borrower, and the PACE lender shall execute the supplemental agreement which, without limitation:
 - (a) Shall inform the participants that the PACE loan amount shall, if requested by the Program Administrator, be imposed as and considered a special charge, and any year's annual installment, if delinquent, may be included on the property tax roll of the subject property as a special charge and an annual installment that is delinquent shall be a lien against the subject property pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.027 as may be amended;
 - (b) Shall recite the amount and the term of the PACE loan;
 - (c) Shall provide for the amount or a method for determining the amount of the annual installment due each year;
 - (d) Shall provide whether default interest shall be applied to unpaid annual installments;

- (e) Shall require the PACE lender and the borrower to comply with all federal, state, and local lending and disclosure requirements:
- (f) Shall provide for any fees payable to the County and/or Program Administrator:
- (g) Shall recite that the supplemental agreement is a covenant that runs with the land:
- (h) May provide for prepayments of annual installments by the borrower with a resulting reduction in the special charge for the prepayment, subject to any prepayment premium charged by the PACE lender, if any; and
- (i) May allow for amendment by the parties.
- (2) Prior to executing the supplemental agreement, the owner of the subject property, if different from the borrower, and any existing mortgage holder(s) on the subject property must have executed a separate writing acknowledging the borrower's use of PACE financing for the subject property and the special charge that will be imposed under this Chapter and its consequences, including the remedies for collecting the special charge.
- (3) Each PACE loan shall be amortized over the term of the PACE loan as provided in the supplemental agreement.
- (4) The annual payments of a PACE loan may be payable in installments as authorized by Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 as may be amended.
- 8.08 ANNUAL INSTALLMENTS ADDED TO TAX ROLLS. Upon the request of the Program Administrator, the County shall place any year's annual installment, if delinquent, on the tax roll for the subject property as permitted pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0627 as may be amended.
- 8.09 REMITTANCE OF SPECIAL CHARGES. The County shall promptly remit to the Wisconsin PACE Commission any payment(s) it receives with respect to any special charge imposed under this Section including penalties and charges thereon it may receive from any taxing district or the County Treasurer pursuant to Wis. Stat. Ch. 74, as amended, subject to the County retaining any agreed-upon portion thereof for its own costs and expenses attributable to administering the PACE loan and its collection.

8.10 PROPERTY TAX FORECLOSURE PROCEDURES.

- (1) If a subject property owner fails to pay any special charges imposed on the subject property under this Section as required, the county may proceed in collecting the special charge pursuant to Chapter 91 of this Code.
- (2) The County shall begin an *in rem* property tax foreclosure proceeding on the subject property at the earliest time allowed under the Wisconsin Statutes

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 27 (2016/17)

Re: Approving Borrowing in Excess of Budget Control Policy

WHEREAS, the Finance Committee is presenting a 2017 County budget that contemplates new capital project expenditures in the amount of \$18,733,620 to be financed through the issuance of general obligation bonds pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 67.05, and

WHEREAS, under the proposed 5-Year Capital Plan, the Finance Committee expects that in 2017, there will need to be capital project expenditures in the amount of \$10 Million to be financed through the issuance of general obligation bonds, and

WHEREAS, by the enactment of Section 5.07(b) of the County Code, the County Board expressed a policy whereby the County would not adopt any new County budget which provided for borrowing in excess of \$5.5 Million per year or \$11 Million for a two-year period for capital projects through the issuance of general obligation bonds pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 67.05 unless the County Board, by 2/3 vote, adopted a separate Resolution approving the excess borrowing, and

WHEREAS, under ordinary circumstances, the County has been borrowing in two-year increments and, based on this cycle and the requirements of Section 5.07(b), the County budget would normally provide for no borrowing in 2017 and borrowing up to \$11 Million in 2018, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to proceed with an unprecedented amount of capital project spending at this time because of the impending obsolescence of the County's Transportation Department facilities which will have long-term consequences for the County and its residents if it is not addressed through bonding for new construction, the projects have been approved by the County Board in the 5-Year Capital Plan process, and the proposed 2017 budget proposes 2017 borrowing of up to \$10 Million, and

WHEREAS, the excess borrowing beyond \$11 Million as provided for in this budget and is particularly appropriate in that the County Board is able to take advantage of and lock in the historically low interest rates that are currently available, and

WHEREAS, given the historically low interest rates as currently available, the future expense of servicing this additional borrowing is not significantly greater than the expense of servicing \$5.5 Million per year in borrowing at the interest rates in place in 2001 when the Board initially enacted Section 5.07 of the County Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board acknowledges that the capital borrowing contained in the proposed 2017 budget exceeds the Section 5.07 expenditure limit of

WHEREAS, the third component is the County Aid to Bridges required by Wis. WHEREAS, the fourth component is the Sheboygan County portion of the Eastern Shores Library System approved for the budget and an apportionment adjustment for the Eastern Shores Library System and required by Wis. Re: Modifying Taylor Park Regulations

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County's Code provisions relating to Taylor Park hours recite that the Park is closed between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., and

WHEREAS, with recent improvements to the Taylor Park infrastructure, the Property Committee believes that it is in the best interests of the County that the Property Committee be given the authority to determine when the Park will be open to the public, pursuant to Section 39.04 of the County Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Modifying Park Regulations</u>. Section 39.02 of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

39.02 USE OF PARK. Taylor Park is open for use by the public without charge except the park shall be closed to users and vehicular traffic between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. During the hours when the Park is open, two (2) specific areas that may be reserved by permit obtained from the County Clerk. Such permit(s) shall be granted for a non-refundable fee, which fee shall be set by the Property Committee, and on the condition that the holder of the permit shall be responsible for clean-up and restoring the area to its condition prior to such use. In addition, each permit holder shall be charged a key deposit, which deposit shall be set by the Property Committee, and which shall be refunded by the County Clerk upon return of the keys and upon notification by the Building Services Department that the Park was clean and in good condition.

Section 2. <u>Effective Date</u>. The herein Ordinance shall take effect upon enactment.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 09 (2016/17)

Re: Amending Library System Provisions to Reflect Merger

WHEREAS, through the adoption of Resolution No. 14 (2016/17), the Sheboygan County Board approved the proposed merger of the Eastern Shores Library System, in which it participates with Ozaukee County, with the Mid-Wisconsin Library System, comprised of Dodge County and Washington County, and

WHEREAS, all four impacted County Boards passed merger resolutions, and

WHEREAS, with the approval of all four impacted counties, the merger will proceed to establish a new entity to be called the "Monarch Library System," and

WHEREAS, Chapter 80 of the County Code needs to be amended to conform to the terms of the merger;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Amending Code</u>. Chapter 80 of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows (strikeouts indicating deletions, redlining indicating additions):

- 80.01 PURPOSE. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish a Joint Federated Public Library System within the geographical boundaries of Sheboygan, and Ozaukee, Dodge, and Washington Counties. It is hereby intended that each municipal public library be retained and maintained and that existing library boards retain autonomy with regard to providing library services within their individual community. The Joint Federated Public Library System is intended to support, extend, and supplement the resources and services of the present public libraries operating in Sheboygan, and-Ozaukee, Dodge, and Washington Counties so as to make accessible to their county residents a wider variety of public library benefits.
- 80.02 JOINT FEDERATED PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM ESTABLISHED. There is hereby established a Joint Federated Public Library System for Sheboygan, and Ozaukee, Dodge, and Washington Counties ("Library System") as described in Wis. Stat. § 43.19(1)(b) which system shall be in effect for all of Sheboygan County, and all of Ozaukee County, all of Dodge County, and all of Washington County, which shall be known as the EASTERN-SHORESMONARCH LIBRARY SYSTEM.
- 80.03 GOVERNING BOARD. Pursuant to the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 43.19 the Library System shall be governed by a board to be known as the Eastern SheresMonarch Library System Board consisting of fifteen (15) members; nine (9) four (4) members shall be appointed by the Sheboygan County Board, and six (6) three (3) members shall be appointed by the Ozaukee County Board, three (3) members shall be appointed by the Dodge County Board, and five (5) members shall be appointed by the Washington County Board. (The Sheboygan County

 appointments shall follow the usual procedure of appointment by the Executive Committeebe subject to confirmation by the full County Board.)

- (a)(1) Membership. Sheboygan County membership of the Board shall be composed of nine (9)four (4) members, including one (1) member from the County Board, one (1) member from the governing board of the resource library, three-(3)one (1) members of a participating local library boards, and four (4)one (1) members-at-large.
- (b)(2) Term. The members initially appointed shall be divided as nearly as possible into three (3) equal groups to serve for terms expiring on January 1 of the second, third, and fourth years, respectively, following their appointment. Thereafter, regular terms shall be for three (3) years and shall commence on January 1. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as regular appointments are made.
- (e)(3) Board Organization. As soon as practicable after the initial establishment of the System, and thereafter in January of each year, the Board shall organize by the election, from among its members, a president and such other officers as it deems necessary.
- (d)(4) Powers and Duties. The System Board shall possess the powers expressly declared in Wis. Stat. §§ 43.58 through 43.62 and 43.60 and shall have such duties as set forth in Wis. Stat. § 43.17 and as may be delegated to it from time to time by the County Board, subject, however, to the statutory limitations of Wis. Stat. ch. 43 and particularly those which provide that local library boards shall retain responsibility for their own public libraries.
- 80.04 RESOURCES LIBRARY DESIGNATED. The resource library (also known as the headquarters library) for the Library System shall be the City of Sheboygan-Mead Public Library. As such, this library will serve as a reference and information referral center for inquiries from participating libraries.
- 80.05 FINANCING THE LIBRARY SYSTEM. Budget responsibility for the Library System shall rest with Sheboygan, and—Ozaukee, Dodge, and Washington Counties. The Library System is a joint agency of those counties but constitutes a separate legal entity for the following purposes: To have the exclusive custody and control of all System funds; to hold title to and dispose of property; to construct, enlarge, and improve buildings; to make contracts; and to sue and be sued.
 - (1) Exemption from Levy. The County Board shall levy a tax to provide funds for the Library System and shall include the amount of any such tax in the general County tax. Any city, town, or village in Sheboygan County shall be exempted from that portion of the general County tax allocated for the Library System operation if such city, town, or village expends for a library fund, during the year for which the tax levy is made, a sum at least equal to the sum which it would have paid toward the County tax levy for the Library System in the prior year.
