The Sheboygan County Transportation Committee convened at 9:00 a.m. Chairman Te Stroete presiding. Chairman Te Stroete noted that the meeting was posted on May 28, 2020 at 2:15 p.m. in the lobby of the Administration Building in compliance with the open meeting law.

Per County Code, Chairman Te Stroete approved the minutes from March 2020 as presented.

Supervisor Wegner made a motion and Supervisor Bosman seconded the motion to approve the vouchers. Motion carried.

Airport Superintendent, Matt Grenoble stated fuel flowage amounts have drastically decreased due to the COVID pandemic. Grenoble stated that almost all corporate travel had stopped for two-three weeks. It was explained that April 2020 was the worst month as the amount of fuel sold was down 60% from April 2019. The fuel sold in May 2020 was down 38% from May 2019 and today the fuel sold was down 31% from that in June 2020. Grenoble said that the cancellation of the EAA, the T28 flying clinic and Wings & Wheels event have also contributed to the reduction of fuel sales. Grenoble stated that as of this date, the Ryder Cup is still on schedule for September 2020.

Superintendent Grenoble advised that due to the CARES Act, general aviation airports are each getting \$69,000 in stimulus funds that can be used for various projects. Grenoble stated that the Customs building is one month to scheduled completion. Grenoble stated that he has been approached about the possibility of building other hangars which would bring in lease revenue for the airport.

Transportation Director Schnell stated that Terence Doyle from the Right Way Club from Sheboygan is interested in purchasing several feet of property from the Transportation Department on EE / South 12th Street. Supervisor Bosman made a motion and Supervisor Ziegelbauer seconded the motion to have Corp Council draft an ordinance to sell 10 feet of the property.

Supervisor Wegner made a motion and Supervisor Veldman seconded the motion to appoint Supervisor Bosman to the East Wisconsin Counties Railroad Consortium.

Supervisor Wegner made a motion and Supervisor Ziegelbauer seconded the motion to approve the Chapter 58: Reporting County Owned Vehicles.

Supervisor Bosman made a motion and Supervisor Wegner seconded the motion to approve the ATV Permit for the Town of Scott but excluding the use of CTH A from CTH HH to STH 28 and referred to using the roads less traveled, per the ordinance.

Supervisor Wegner made a motion and Supervisor Ziegelbauer seconded the motion to approve the ATV Permit for the Town of Mitchell.

Supervisor Ziegelbauer made a motion and Supervisor Wegner seconded the motion to approve the Promotion of Maintenance Worker to Maintenance Technician.

Transportation Director Schnell provided the 1st Quarter variances for the Highway and Airport Departments.

Director Schnell discussed the Transportation Department activities. Concerns that due to the COVID pandemic the sales taxes are also down which will affect the Transportation Fund budget. (Chairman Te Stroete left at 10:20 am, Vice Chair Wegner carried on presiding over the meeting.) The Department has cut \$2.5 million in construction projects but is filling the work from other agencies and towns. Schnell hopes to continue 3.5 miles of road construction on CTH D starting mid-June. The employees are currently pulverizing, paving, seal coating and repairing culverts.

Motion by Supervisor Bosman and seconded by Supervisor Veldman to adjourn at 10:30 a.m., motion carried.

INDEMNIFICATION

The following shall be a condition of all ATV/UTV permits:

Applicant shall save and hold County, its officers, employees, agents, and all private and governmental contractors and subcontractors with the county Wis. Stat. ch. 84, harmless from and against all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims. demands, and actions of any nature whatsoever (including any by Applicant itself) which arise out of or are connected with, or are claimed to arise out of, or be connected with any of the work done by Applicant or the construction or maintenance of facilities by Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way, (1) while Applicant is performing its work or (2) while any of Applicant's property, equipment, or personnel are in or about such place or the vicinity thereof or (3) while any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way; including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, all liability, damages, loss, expense, claims, demands and actions on account of personal injury, death or property loss to County, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters; to Applicant, its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenter; or to any other persons, whether based upon or claimed to be based upon, statutory (including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, worker's compensation), contractual, tort, or other liability of Applicant or any other persons and whether or not caused or claimed to have been caused by active or inactive negligence or other breach of duty by Applicant its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions indemnified against shall include all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions for damage to any property, lines, or facilities placed by or on behalf of Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way in the past or present or that are located on any highway or county property or right-of-way with or without a permit issued by County for any loss of data, information, or material; for trademark, copyright, or patent infringement; for unfair competition or infringement of any other so-called "intangible" property right; for defamation, false arrest, malicious prosecution, or any other infringement of personal or property rights of any kind whatever. Applicant shall, at its own expense, investigate all such claims and demands, attend to their settlement or other disposition, defend all actions based thereon, and pay all charges of attorneys and all other costs and expenses of any kind arising from any such liability, damage, loss; claims, demands, and actions.

Any transfer, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall not release Applicant from any of the indemnification requirements of this permit unless County is notified of such transfer in writing. Any acceptance by any other person or entity, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall include acceptance of all of the indemnification requirements of this permit by the other person or entity receiving ownership or control.

Applicant, by execution of this application, does not waive any governmental or sovereign immunity. Both Applicant and County retain all applicable governmental immunities, defenses, and statutory limitations available including Wis. Stat. §§ 893.80, 895.52 and 345.05.

Our Town has enacted an ATV/UTV Ordinance in accordance with the Wisconsin State statute 23.33. We have enclosed a copy of the Ordinance and a listing of the County roads we would like as ATV routes. While we were rejected from opening Hwy A from Batavia to Beechwood. We feel this is an important connection. It is the only way to get from the north side of the Town to the south side. It also is a vital route to the Town Hall for our residents. Rather than open only half of the road and create confusion, we are requesting the entire road. This will prevent illegal riding as the farms in the area already use this route frequently.





All-Terrain Vehicle Route TOWN OF SCOTT, Sheboygan County

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND REGULATING THE OPERATION OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES

Section | - Intent

The Town of Scott, Sheboygan County adopts the following all-terrain vehicle route for the operation of all-terrain vehicles upon all township roads. Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighed against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created

Section II - Statutory Authority

Open usage of township roads is done pursuant to township authority as authorized by 23.33 (8) (b), Wis stats. The applicable provisions of 23.33 regulating ATV/UTV operation pursuant to routes are adopted.

Section III - Routes

All township roads will be open to ATV/UTV usage <u>unless otherwise posted</u>. All county and state roadways posted 35mph or less will be open to ATV/UTV usage as authorized under Wis. Stat. s. 23.33(11)(am)4 <u>unless otherwise posted</u>.

Section IV - Conditions

As condition for use of township roads, the following conditions shall apply to all operators (and passengers);

- A. All ATV/UTV operators shall observe posted speed limits
- B. No person under 18 years of age may operate or be a passenger on an ATV/UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required under s. 347.485(1)(a) and with the chin strap properly fastened, except as specifically exempted under s. 23.33(3g)(b, c and d) Wis. Stats
- C. All ATV/UTV operators under 16 years old must be in direct verbal supervision of a parent or legal guardian when operating on a designated all-terrain vehicle route.
- D. Operation of ATVs and UTVs on roadways designated as ATV/UTV Routes are authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway, on the paved surface (if the roadway is paved), except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- E. Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to direction if vehicle is not equipped with turn signals.
- F. All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- G. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall obey all traffic laws, Local ordinances and DNR Regulations
- H. The operator of an ATV/UTV shall display a lighted headlamp, tail lamp and working brake light on the ATV/UTV and display the registration license plate at all times.
- I. All roads must be signed in accordance with NR 64.12, and NR 64.12 (7)

- J. ATV/UTV operation is at the risk of the operator. The TOWN OF SCOTT has no liability for any damage or injury to persons, real property or personal property, arising out of the operation of ATVs and UTVs on designated ATV/UTV Routes under s. 895.52 (1)(d)(g) Wis. Stats
- K. Routes are open year round.
- L. On all roads shared with another jurisdiction the most restrictive Ordinance shall apply.
- M. The Town reserves the right to open or close routes by a simple Board motion

Section V - Enforcement

This ordinance shall be enforced by any law enforcement officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

Section VI - Penalties

Wisconsin State All-Terrain Vehicle penalties as found in s. 23.33 (13) (a) Wis Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section VII - Severability

The provision of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Township would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

Section VIII - Effective Date

This ordinance becomes effective upon passage and publication.
