JOURNAL OF THE MEETING OF THE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

April 26, 2022

Pursuant to Section 59.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the April 26, 2022 session of the Sheboygan County Board was called to order by Chairperson Koch at 6:00 p.m. Chairperson Koch noted that the notice of meeting was posted on April 22, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.

The roll call was taken and recorded with 23 Supervisors present.; Absent: 2. Supervisors Coulson and Smith.

Supervisor Brauer moved for approval of the April 19, 2022 Journal, which was distributed to all supervisors prior to the meeting. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Wegner and carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

The Clerk presented a resolution from the Town of Vinland (Winnebago County) Board of Supervisors supporting NACo's position on defining waters of the United States. By Chairperson referred to the Planning, Resources, Agriculture and Extension Committee.

Resolution 12-22

Request State to Revise the Current Real Estate Transfer Fees Revenue Sharing Formula

WHEREAS, the collection of a real estate transfer fee by countles was mandated by the State of Wisconsin in 1969, and included a requirement that counties remit 50% of all transfer fees collected to the State; and

WHEREAS, in 1981 the State changed the transfer fee formula to require counties to remit 80% of all transfer fees collected to the State; and

WHEREAS, the County, through the Register of Deeds Office, assumes the annual operating costs of recording all real estate transfers occurring in each County, including the collection of real estate transfer fees; and

WHEREAS, Price County real estate transfer fee collections over the past five years totaled \$1,134,608, of which the County retained \$227,460 and \$907,148 was remitted to the State; and

WHEREAS, using a 50/50 split, the County's share of fees collected on local real estate transfers during that same five year period would have provided an additional \$339,844 in support of local government; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the State of Wisconsin has built up a budget surplus of approximately \$2.5 billion dollars, while many Wisconsin counties continue to struggle financially due to the ever-increasing costs of providing county government services in an inflationary economy and providing services for increasing unfunded State mandated programs along with the financial restrictions imposed by State imposed levy limits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Price County Board of Supervisors that in an effort to assist all Wisconsin Counties, the State of Wisconsin revise the real estate transfer fee share formula to again allow Wisconsin Counties to retain 50% of all real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% to be remitted to the State.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Governor Tony Evers, all members of the State Legislature representing Price County, the Wisconsin Counties Association and all other Wisconsin Counties.

RE: ADVISORY REFERENDUM ON CLEAN WATER

WHEREAS, there are numerous indicators that the citizens of La Crosse County are concerned about groundwater and surface water issues including contamination from nitrates, PFAS, lead in drinking water, toxic algal blooms, flooding, and over pumping from high capacity wells;

WHEREAS, the Health and Human Service Board is directly involved in local and regional discussions focusing on surface water and groundwater issues and is statutorily charged with considering issues related to these topics; and,

WHEREAS, the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors has passed resolutions asking for the State of Wisconsin to pursue initiatives related to surface water and groundwater issues;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors, in legal session assembled, does hereby approve that the following question be placed on the April 5, 2022 ballot as an advisory referendum:

Question: Shall the State of Wisconsin establish a right to clean water to protect human health, the environment, and the diverse cultural and natural heritage of Wisconsin? YES or NO

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Corporation Counsel shall prepare an explanation of a yes or no vote to be published by the La Crosse County Clerk in accordance with statutory requirements; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution and the referendum shall be filed with the La Crosse County Clerk no later than 70 days prior to the April 5, 2021 election, at which the question will appear on the ballot; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the La Crosse County Clerk is directed to send the results of the referendum to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association, all Wisconsin County Boards, and to local members of the State Legislature.

FISCAL NOTE: Approximately \$5,000 for the preparation and noticing of the referendum ballot.

Resolution to Support NACo's Position on Defining the Waters of the United States (WOTUS) and Regulations with Agricultural Considerations

WHEREAS, the Biden Administration recently announced the signing of a proposed rule to revise the definition of Waters of the United States (WOTUS); and

WHEREAS, the proposed rule expands federal jurisdiction by changing the WOTUS definition to include waters that significantly affect the chemical, physical, or biological integrity of traditional navigable waters, interstate waters, and the territorial seas (the "foundational waters") and waters that are relatively permanent or that have a continuous surface connection to such waters; and

WHEREAS, the proposed WOTUS definition directly impacts local governments as owners and operators of local infrastructure, co-regulators and stewards of the environment; and

WHEREAS, counties own and operate public safety water conveyances, stormwater municipal separate stormwater sewer systems (MS4), green infrastructure construction and maintenance projects, water reuse and infrastructure, and emergency management readiness; and

WHEREAS, counties may need to apply for a federal permit to maintain or build new infrastructure projects such as: roads and roadside ditches, flood control channels, drainage conveyances, culverts, bioswales, vegetative buffers, constructed wetlands, stormwater detention ponds, etc.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Vinland that it hereby supports the National Association of Counties (NACo) position which advocates for a definition that is consistent with traditionally navigable waters, territorial seas, their regularly flowing tributaries, and abutting wetlands.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Vinland that it supports clear, concise language that is easy for counties to interpret without the need to hire experts or legal counsel and so that a reasonable person would be able to identify that a body of water is either regulated by the federal government or by their state government.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Vinland that it hereby urges the administration and the U.S. Congress to fully adopt the initial intent of the Clean Water Act recognizing state and local authorities working together with federal regulatory agencies to protect rural, disadvantaged frontier communities, from regulations adversely affecting the nation's agricultural supply chain.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Vinland that the Town Clerk/Treasurer forward this resolution to NACo, WCA, and all Wisconsin counties and the county administration send this resolution to the Biden Administration, federal Congressional delegation, Evers Administration, and relevant stakeholder groups.
