

JOURNAL OF THE MEETING OF THE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

December 16, 2025

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.11, the December 16, 2025 session of the Sheboygan County Board was called to order by Chairperson Keith Abler at 6:00 p.m. Chairperson Abler noted that the notice of meeting was posted on December 12, 2025 at 3:00 p.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.

The roll call was taken and recorded with 21 Supervisors present; 1 Supervisor attended remotely: Supervisor Kuhlow, Absent: 3, Supervisors Jorgensen, Liebau, and Smith; Vacant: 1, District #3

Supervisor Wegner moved for approval of the November 4, 2025 Journal, which was distributed to all supervisors prior to the meeting. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Goehring and carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

Supervisor Jorgensen joined the meeting in person at 6:03 p.m.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

County Administrator Alayne Krause thanked Dr. Zils for his presentation to the Sheboygan County Emergency Communications Center and all of the dispatchers for this prestigious award. Ms. Krause welcomed new County Board Supervisor Kurt Jensen and Finance Director James Webb. Ms. Krause gave a brief overview of some of the items being voted on: Ordinance No. 12-Creating Section 64.19 Regarding a Permit Process for Certain Vendors at the Sheboygan County Memorial International Airport, Ordinance No. 13-Changing Supervisors District Boundaries to Reflect Annexation Supervisor Districts 1, 5, 10, 17 and 21 which were all vacant land, and also reviewed the Joint County Library Service Plan 2026-2030 and stated that Ozaukee County adopted their plan on December 3, 2025.

The Clerk read the report of the Executive Committee regarding **Ordinance No. 13 (2025/26) Changing Supervisory District Boundaries to Reflect Annexation Supervisory Districts 1, 5, 10, 17, and 21** recommending enactment.

The Clerk read the report of the Finance Committee regarding **Resolution No. 15 (2025/26) Approving Intention to Join the Statewide Public Safety Interoperable Communications System for Sheboygan County** recommending adoption.

Supervisor Koch moved to adopt the resolution. The motion was seconded by Supervisor Ellis and carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

The Clerk read the report of the Transportation Committee regarding **Ordinance No. 12 (2025/26) Creating Section 64.19 Regarding a Permit Process for Certain Vendors at the Sheboygan County Memorial International Airport** recommending enactment.

Supervisor Wegner moved to enact the ordinance. Supervisor Clarke seconded the motion which carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

5 **TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

7 **WHEREAS**, the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC) provides
8 vital cybersecurity services, including 24/7 threat monitoring and incident response, to more
9 than 18,000 state, local, tribal, and territorial (SLTT) government organizations supporting
10 our nation's critical infrastructure including public hospitals, public utilities, K-12 school, and
11 law enforcement; and

13 **WHEREAS**, local governments, especially in rural and under-resourced areas, have relied
14 heavily on MS-ISAC's services; and

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16 **WHEREAS**, without MS-ISAC services, government organizations are increasingly
17 vulnerable to cyber attacks by foreign adversaries; and

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19 **WHEREAS**, recent federal funding cuts to MS-ISAC, have significantly weakened the
20 nation's defense against cyber threats; and

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22 **WHEREAS**, Winnebago County joined MS-ISAC under the Single Organization
23 Membership option on September 1, 2025, when funding ended, to continue the services
24 Winnebago County needed to protect its infrastructure and data; and

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26 **WHEREAS**, MS-ISAC has said the fees paid by Winnebago County will be refunded or
27 applied to other add-on services should Wisconsin obtain membership with MS-ISAC in the
28 future.

30 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors
31 that it supports Wisconsin establishing a Membership with the Multi-State Information
32 Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC) to Cover the Cost of Membership for all State,
33 Local, Tribal and Territorial (SLTT) Organizations.
