



The following shall be a condition of all ATV/UTV permits:

Applicant shall save and hold County, its officers, employees, agents, and all private and governmental contractors and subcontractors with the county Wis. Stat. ch. 84, harmless from and against all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions of any nature whatsoever (including any by Applicant itself) which arise out of or are connected with, or are claimed to arise out of, or be connected with any of the work done by Applicant or the construction or maintenance of facilities by Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way, (1) while Applicant is performing its work or (2) while any of Applicant's property, equipment, or personnel are in or about such place or the vicinity thereof or (3) while any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way; including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, all liability, damages, loss, expense, claims, demands and actions on account of personal injury, death or property loss to County, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters; to Applicant, its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenter; or to any other persons, whether based upon or claimed to be based upon, statutory (including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, worker's compensation), contractual, tort, or other liability of Applicant or any other persons and whether or not caused or claimed to have been caused by active or inactive negligence or other breach of duty by Applicant its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions indemnified against shall include all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions for damage to any property, lines, or facilities placed by or on behalf of Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way in the past or present or that are located on any highway or county property or right-of-way with or without a permit issued by County for any loss of data, information, or material; for trademark, copyright, or patent infringement; for unfair competition or infringement of any other so-called "intangible" property right; for defamation, false arrest, malicious prosecution, or any other infringement of personal or property rights of any kind whatever. Applicant shall, at its own expense, investigate all such claims and demands, attend to their settlement or other disposition. defend all actions based thereon, and pay all charges of attorneys and all other costs and expenses of any kind arising from any such liability, damage, loss; claims, demands, and actions.


Any transfer, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall not release Applicant from any of the indemnification requirements of this permit unless County is notified of such transfer in writing. Any acceptance by any other person or entity, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall include acceptance of all of the indemnification requirements of this permit by the other person or entity receiving ownership or control.

Applicant, by execution of this application, does not waive any governmental or sovereign immunity. Both Applicant and County retain all applicable governmental immunities, defenses, and statutory limitations available including Wis. Stat. §§ 893.80, 895.52 and 345.05.

TOWN OF HOLLAND ORDINANCE NO. 2022-04

ORDINANCE CREATING ARTICLE VII OF CHAPTER 318 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF HOLLAND, SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Board of the Town of Holland, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, that Article VII of Chapter 318 of the Code of the Town of Holland is hereby created to read as follows:

CHAPTER 318 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

ARTICLE VII All-Terrain Vehicles and Utility Terrain Vehicles

§ 318-24. **Definitions.**

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

All-terrain vehicle (ATV)

A commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that has a weight, without fluids, of 900 pounds or less; has a width of not more than 50 inches as measured laterally between the outermost wheel rim on each side of the vehicle, exclusive of tires, mirrors, and accessories that are not essential to the vehicle's basic operation; is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator; and travels on 3 or more tires; as defined in Wis. Stats., § 340.01(2g).

Utility terrain vehicle (UTV)

Any of the following, as defined in Wis. Stats., § 23.33(1)(ng):

- 1. A commercially designed and manufactured motor-driven device that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured with, all of the following:
 - a. A weight, without fluids, of 3,000 pounds or less.
 - b. Four or more tires.
 - d. A steering wheel.
 - e. A tail light.
 - f. A brake light.
 - g. Two headlights.
- h. A width of not more than 65 inches as measured laterally between the outermost wheel rim on each side of the vehicle, exclusive of tires, mirrors, and accessories that are not essential to the vehicle's basic operation.
- j. A system of seat belts, or a similar system, for restraining each occupant of the device in the event of an accident.
- k. A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as the result of a rollover of the device.
- 2. A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device to which all of the following applies:
- a. It does not meet federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012; is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, mini-truck, or tracked vehicle; is designed to be used primarily off of a highway; and has, and was originally manufactured with, a weight, without fluids, of not more than 3,000

pounds.

- b. It has a width of 65 inches or less as measured laterally between the outermost wheel rim on each side of the vehicle, exclusive of tires, mirrors, and accessories that are not essential to the vehicle's basic operation.
 - c. It is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator.
 - d. It travels on 3 or more tires.
 - e. It is not an all-terrain vehicle, as defined in Wis. Stats., § 340.01(2g).

§ 318-25. Statutory Authority; adoption of statutory provisions.

ATV/UTV usage of town roads is permitted pursuant to town authority as authorized by Wis. Stats., § 23.33(8)(b). The provisions of Wis. Stats., § 23.33 and Wis. Stats., Chs. 340 to 348 establishing definitions and regulations with respect to ATVs and UTVs and Wis. Admin. Code, § NR 64, and any future amendments or revisions thereto, are hereby adopted by reference.

§ 318-26. Routes.

A. All town roads located within the Town of Holland shall be open to ATV/UTV usage unless otherwise posted. ATV/UTV Routes are open year-round.

§ 318-27. Conditions of operation.

As a condition for use of town roads, the following conditions shall apply to all operators and any passengers;

- 1. All ATV and UTV operators shall observe posted speed limits.
- 2. No person under 18 years of age may operate or be a passenger on an ATV or UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required under Wis. Stats., § 347.485(1)(a) and with the chin strap properly fastened, except as specifically exempted under Wis. Stats., § 23.33(3g)(b), (c) and (d).
- 3. Operation of ATVs and UTVs on roadways designated as ATV/UTV Routes are authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway, on the paved surface (if the roadway is paved), except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- 4. All ATV and UTV operators shall ride single file.
- 5. The operator of an ATV or UTV shall obey all traffic laws, local ordinances and DNR Regulations.
- 6. The operator of an ATV or UTV shall display a lighted headlamp and tail lamp on the ATV or UTV and display the registration or license plate at all times during operation.
- 7. Town roads used must be posted with signs in accordance with Wis. Admin. Code, § NR 64.12 and § NR 64.12 (7).
- 8. ATV or UTV operation is at the risk of the operator and any passengers. The Town of Holland has no liability for any damage or injury to persons, real property or personal property, arising out of the operation of ATVs and UTVs on designated ATV/UTV Routes.
- 9. No person may operate an ATV or UTV that travels on anything other than tires.
- 10. No person (except emergency services personal) may operate an ATV or UTV that is equipped with any of the following:
- A. A lamp that emits any color of light other than white or amber and that is visible from directly in front of the ATV or UTV.
- B. A lamp that emits any color of light other than red, yellow, amber, or white and that is visible from directly behind the ATV or UTV.
 - C. A flashing, oscillating, or rotating lamp that emits any color other than yellow or amber.

- 11. Any person operating an ATV or UTV must dim their high-beam headlamps and any auxiliary lamps when within 500 feet of an approaching ATV, UTV or other vehicle, and within 500 feet to the rear of another ATV, UTV or other vehicle. In addition, an operator must dim their backup lamps unless actively backing.
 - 12. No open intoxicants are allowed in or upon any ATV or UTV while the vehicle is in operation.

§ 318-28. Enforcement.

A. Pursuant to Wis. Stats., § 23.33(12), any state traffic patrol officer under Wis. Stats., § 110.07(1); inspector under Wis. Stats., § 110.07(3); conservation warden appointed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources under Wis. Stats., § 23.10; or county sheriff officer has authority and jurisdiction to enforce this Article.

B. No operator of an ATV or UTV may refuse to stop after being requested or signaled to do so by a law enforcement officer or a conservation warden.

§ 318-29. Penalties.

Wisconsin State All-Terrain Vehicle penalties as found in Wis Stats., § 23.33(13)(a) are hereby adopted by reference. The penalty for any violation of this Article not addressed in Wis. Stats., § 23.33(13)(a) shall be as set forth in Chapter 1, Article I of this Code.

\S 318-30. Town Clerk to provide required notices.

Pursuant to Wis. Stats., § 23.33(11)(b), following adoption, the Town Clerk shall provide copies of this ordinance to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Wisconsin State Patrol, and the Sheboygan County Sheriff's Office.

This Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and posting.





INDEMNIFICATION

The following shall be a condition of all ATV/UTV permits:

Applicant shall save and hold County, its officers, employees, agents, and all private and governmental contractors and subcontractors with the county Wis. Stat. ch. 84, harmless from and against all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands. and actions of any nature whatsoever (including any by Applicant itself) which arise out of or are connected with, or are claimed to arise out of, or be connected with any of the work done by Applicant or the construction or maintenance of facilities by Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way, (1) while Applicant is performing its work or (2) while any of Applicant's property, equipment, or personnel are in or about such place or the vicinity thereof or (3) while any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way; including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, all liability, damages, loss, expense, claims, demands and actions on account of personal injury, death or property loss to County, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters; to Applicant, its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenter; or to any other persons, whether based upon or claimed to be based upon, statutory (including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, worker's compensation), contractual, tort, or other liability of Applicant or any other persons and whether or not caused or claimed to have been caused by active or inactive negligence or other breach of duty by Applicant its employees, agents, contractors, subcontractors, or frequenters. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions indemnified against shall include all liability, damage, loss, expense, claims, demands, and actions for damage to any property, lines, or facilities placed by or on behalf of Applicant pursuant to this permit or any other permit issued by County for location of property, lines, or facilities on highway right-of-way in the past or present or that are located on any highway or county property or right-of-way with or without a permit issued by County for any loss of data, information, or material; for trademark, copyright, or patent infringement; for unfair competition or infringement of any other so-called "intangible" property right; for defamation, false arrest, malicious prosecution, or any other infringement of personal or property rights of any kind whatever. Applicant shall, at its own expense, investigate all such claims and demands, attend to their settlement or other disposition, defend all actions based thereon, and pay all charges of attorneys and all other costs and expenses of any kind arising from any such liability, damage, loss; claims, demands, and actions.

Any transfer, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall not release Applicant from any of the indemnification requirements of this permit unless County is notified of such transfer in writing. Any acceptance by any other person or entity, whether voluntary or involuntary, of ownership or control of any property constructed, placed, or operated by or on behalf of Applicant that remains on County's property or right-of-way pursuant to this permit shall include acceptance of all of the indemnification requirements of this permit by the other person or entity receiving ownership or control.

Applicant, by execution of this application, does not waive any governmental or sovereign immunity. Both Applicant and County retain all applicable governmental immunities, defenses, and statutory limitations available including Wis. Stat. §§ 893.80, 895.52 and 345.05.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 17 ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE ROUTES AND REGULATIONS IN THE TOWN OF GREENBUSH, SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 23.33, the Town may designate certain roads/highways within its jurisdiction as all-terrain vehicle or utility terrain vehicle (ATV/UTV) routes;

WHEREAS, the Town Board upon consideration of the recreational value to connect ATV/UTV routes with routes established in adjacent municipalities, was weighed against possible danger, public health, liability, traffic density, and history of automobile traffic and as authorized by Wis. Stat. § 23.33(8)(b); and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that it is in the public interest to designate portions of certain Town roads/highways as all-terrain vehicle routes as connectors between town, city, and village roads designated for ATV/UTV routes.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Town Board of the Town of Greenbush, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Creating Code</u>. Chapter 17 entitled All-Terrain Vehicle Routes and Regulations of the Town of Greenbush Municipal Code is hereby created to read as follows:

"17.01 All-Terrain Vehicle Routes and Regulation.

(1) Routes.

Within the municipal limits of the Town of Greenbush, All Town roads will be open to all-terrain vehicle/utility terrain vehicle (ATV/UTV) operation unless otherwise posted.

All county and state roadways posted 35mph or less will be open to ATV/UTV operation as authorized under Wis. Stat. S 23.33(11)(am)4 unless otherwise posted.

The Town Chairperson or his or her designee and the Sheboygan County Transportation Director shall have authority to suspend operation on designated routes due to hazard, construction, or emergency conditions.

(2) <u>Conditions</u>.

The following conditions shall apply to all operators and passengers operating ATV/UTVs on Town highways:

(a) All ATV/UTV operators shall observe posted speed limits or maximum speed of 35 miles per hour, whichever is less.

- (b) No person under 18 years of age may operate or be a passenger on an ATV/UTV without wearing protective headgear of the type required under Wis. Stat. § 347.485(1)(a) and with the chin strap properly fastened except as specifically exempted under Wis. Stat. §§ 23.33(3g)(b),(c), and (d).
- (c) Operation of ATVs and UTVs on roadways designated as ATV/UTV routes are authorized only for the extreme right side of the roadway on the paved surface (if the roadway is paved), except that left turns may be made from any part of the roadway that is safe given prevailing conditions.
- (d) Approved hand signals are required whenever the operator intends to change direction if vehicle is not equipped with turn signals.
- (e) All ATV/UTV operators shall ride single file.
- (f) The operator of an ATV/UTV shall obey all traffic laws, local ordinances, and Department of Natural Resources regulations.
- (g) The operator of an ATV/UTV shall display a lighted headlamp, tail lamps, and brake lights on the ATV/UTV and display the registration or license plate at all times.
- (h) ATV/UTV operation is at the risk of the operator. The Town of Greenbush has no liability for any damage or injury to persons, real property, or personal property arising out of the operation of ATVs and UTVs on designated ATV/UTV routes.
- (i) The operator of an ATV/UTV shall operate an ATV/UTV only on such highways approved for ATV/UTV operation. All roads must be signed in accordance with NR 64.12 and NR 64.12 (7). On roads with a shared jurisdiction, the most restrictive ordinance shall apply.
- (k) Except as otherwise allowed by Wis. Stat. § 23.33(5), no person under age 16 may operate an ATV/UTV on a designated route unless accompanied by his or her parent or guardian or person who is at least 18 years of age.
- (I) The Town of Greenbush reserve the right to open and close routes as it deems necessary.

(3) <u>Penalties</u>.

Wisconsin ATV and UTV penalties as found in Wis. Stat. § 23.33(13) are adopted by reference, and any law enforcement officer may issue citations for violation of this Chapter 17 as authorized by Chapter 90 of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances. Issuance of the citation and

payment does not preclude compliance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance."

- Section 2. <u>Sheboygan County Code Adopted</u>. The Town of Greenbush hereby adopts by reference Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances Section 26.07 entitled All-Terrain Vehicle Routes and Regulation, including any amendments hereto, as if fully incorporated herein.
- Section 3. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be deemed affected.
- Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. The herein Ordinance shall take effect upon enactment and publication.
