WHEREAS, the Village Clerk/Treasurer has investigated the Petition and has advised that the Petition is in compliance with Wisconsin Statute § 66.0217(2), in that all of the electors, if any, residing within such territory, and the owners of all of the real property in such territory have signed the Petition; that such Petition was properly filed with the Village Clerk/Treasurer together with a scale map and a legal description of the property showing the boundaries of the property to be annexed and its relationship to the Village; that copies were timely filed with the Town Clerk of the Town of Holland; and that copies thereof were mailed to the Wisconsin Department of Administration; and

WHEREAS, prior to its action on the herein Ordinance, this Village Board has reviewed the advice of the Department of Administration finding that the annexation is in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Oostburg does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Adequacy of Petition</u>. That the above Petition for the unanimous direct annexation of the property described was signed by all the owners of all of the real property in the territory and that there are no electors residing in the territory; and therefore, it is a sufficient and legal Petition conforming to the requirements of Wisconsin Statute § 66.0217(2).

Section 2. Annexation of Territory. The territory described is hereby annexed to the Village of Oostburg and shall be included on the Village Official Zoning Map and temporarily classified under the R-1 Residential Single-Family (Low Density) Zoning District. The Village Clerk/Treasurer is hereby instructed to file immediately with the Secretary of State a certified copy of the Ordinance, Certificate and Plat, and to send one copy to each company that provides any utility service in the area that is annexed. The Village Clerk/treasurer shall also record the Ordinance with the Sheboygan County Register of Deeds and file a signed copy of the Ordinance with the Clerk of the Oostburg School District, all in accordance with Wisconsin Statute § 66.0217.

Section 3. <u>Election Ward</u>. The territory described is hereby made a part of the Second Election Ward of the Village of Oostburg.

Section 4. Agreement to Pay Property Taxes. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 66.0217(14), the Village of Oostburg does hereby agree to pay annually to the Town of Holland, for five (5) years, an amount equal to the property taxes that the Town of Holland levied on the herein described annexed territory, as shown by the Tax Roll under Wis. Stat. § 70.65, in the year in which the annexation is final.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. All ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its passage.



SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 04 (2014/15)

Re: Authorizing Wetland Mitigation Site and Wetland Mitigation Bank Sponsorship

WHEREAS, from time to time, Sheboygan County, in exercising its road construction or other public improvement functions, may need to discharge dredged material or fill material into a wetland which requires a wetland permit issued by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 281.36, and

WHEREAS, one of the requirements for being issued a wetland permit is that the applicant must engage in a wetland mitigation program established by the DNR by means of either purchasing credits from a mitigation bank or participating in the DNR's "in lieu of fee" subprogram, completing mitigation within the same wetland, or completing mitigation within a permittee-responsible mitigation site, and

WHEREAS, it would be advantageous to the County to sponsor its own permittee-responsible wetland mitigation site and purchase from itself credits within a specifically designated and eligible parcel of County-owned property; to wit, the ten- (10-) acre parcel with legal description as follows, and as depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A, and which is on file with the County Clerk:

WHEREAS, it would also be advantageous to the County to sell credits from its own wetland mitigation site to other entities if space is available, and particularly to Shebovgan County businesses or non-profits that may also need to purchase credits, and

WHEREAS, it may be in the County's best long-term interests to create and use its own mitigation bank program if the land for such a program can be obtained on favorable terms:

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

Re: Authorizing Wetland Mitigation Site and Wetland Mitigation Bank Sponsorship

The resolution, if adopted, authorizes and directs the Planning and Conservation Department to apply to the DNR to sponsor a wetland mitigation site. The site under consideration is a ten (10) acre parcel within the Town of Wilson presently owned by the County. Cost to establish the site is estimated by the Planning & Conservation Department to be:

Re: Sale of Additional Excess Former Union Pacific Land in City of Sheboygan (East Side of Tracks)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution Nos. 7 (2011/12) and 18 (2012/13), Sheboygan County acquired the former Union Pacific rail line through the City of Sheboygan for the purpose of developing, administering, and maintaining a multipurpose recreational trail, and

WHEREAS, the parcel includes a portion of a little over 15,000 square feet of land that is not needed for County trail purposes now or in the foreseeable future, and it would be in the public interest to sell the excess land at fair market value so that it can be returned to the tax roll, and

WHEREAS, the excess land is described as:

All rights and interests in those parts of lots 12 through 23, 25, 27, 29, and vacated High Street in Woolverton's Addition, City of Sheboygan, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, which are currently owned by Sheboygan County, a municipal corporation, and which lie northeasterly of a line descried as follows:

Dear County Board of Supervisors,

This correspondence is in reference to the Ordinance change being introduced to you at the June 17, 2014 County Board meeting. The Ordinance change in question is titled "Amending Shoreland Ordinance in Section 3 and Part of Section 10, Town of Mosel (.41 Acres of Property – County Road "LS" Relocation).

At their May 27, 2014 meeting, the Planning, Resources, Agriculture & Extension Committee (PRAECom) unanimously approved the rezoning request and the associated Ordinance language (that which is before you). There was no public comment, and in fact, none of the notified neighbors attended.

I am respectfully requesting that this Ordinance **be pulled from Committee and be considered for immediate action** at the June 17, 2014 County Board meeting.

The reason for this change of procedure is simply due to timing and the ability for the Transportation Department to continue progressing on the relocation portion of the County Highway "LS" project. The rationalization for coming to you this late in the project is, the wetlands in question were delineated by the County's consultant in late fall of 2013. To avoid having to come back to you twice, we waited until we received concurrence from the Department of Natural Resources and the US Army Corp of Engineers (the two regulating agencies on wetlands) that they do not want changes to the delineation. Wetlands cannot be delineated in the winter months or when frost remains in the ground. With the poor winter and spring we experienced this year that meant the concurrence site visit could not take place until early May of 2014. A rezone requires a public hearing which requires at least two weeks public notice. Thus, the earliest PRAECom public hearing meeting that could be held was May 27, 2014.

If the Ordinance is not pulled for immediate action, and another month goes by, the Transportation Department runs the risk of not being able to complete the project prior to the cold weather setting in.

Re: Amending Shoreland Ordinance in Section 3 and Part of Section 10, Town of Mosel (.41 Acres of Property – County Road "LS" Relocation)

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County wishes to rezone .41 acres of wetlands in Section 3 and part of Section 10 in the Town of Mosel "Shoreland-Wetland District" to "Shoreland District" to allow for a portion of the construction necessary for part of the County Road "LS" relocation project, and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Shoreland Ordinance (Chapter 72, Sheboygan County Code), the required procedural steps have been properly completed and the public hearing held, and

WHEREAS, this Committee concludes that the public interest will be served by enactment of this Ordinance in that conservation and environmental protection interests will be carefully honored and monitored;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

- Section 1. Amendment of Shoreland Zoning Map. The "Shoreland Zoning Map, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin" referred to in Section 72.07 of the Sheboygan County Code of General Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:
 - A. The district use classification (boundaries) of the above-described property be changed from the "Shoreland-Wetland District" to the "Shoreland District."
- Section 2. <u>Amending Section 72.07</u>. Section 72.07 is hereby amended as follows (addition indicating by redlining):

SHORELAND DISTRICTS AND BOUNDARIES. The areas of Sheboygan County regulated by this Ordinance as described in Sections 72.05 and 72.06 of this Code are hereby divided into two (2) districts as defined and described in the following Sections 72.09 and 72.10.

The boundaries of the districts shall follow the boundaries illustrated on the following maps which are hereby adopted and made a part of this Ordinance and which are on file with the Department: "Shoreland Zoning Map, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin" and the supporting Wisconsin Wetland Inventory Maps for Sheboygan County as revised by the DNR and as amended through the enactment of Ordinance Nos. 2 and 3 (2013/14), Ordinance No. 12 (2013/14), and the revisions presented to the County most recently at the public hearing held by the Sheboygan County Planning, Resources, Agriculture, and Extension Committee on May 27, 2014, and as subsequently amended by Ordinance No. (2014/15).
