Aaron Brault called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM. Mr. Brault reported the meeting notice had been posted April 21, 2014 at 11:00 AM and the meeting was in compliance with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law.

Mr. Brault welcomed the group.

**Approval of the October 28, 2013 Meeting Minutes** – Ms. Pipping motioned and Supervisor Epping seconded to approve the October 28, 2013 minutes. Motion carried with no objections.

Public input - None.

Consideration of the Sheboygan County Pedestrian & Bicycle Plan 2014 Update –Mr. Brault asked the Committee if there were any comments on the Pedestrian & Bicycle Plan 2014 Update text or maps since the last meeting. He answered several questions regarding the Interurban Trail and Old Plank Road Trail. Mr. Weidert motioned and Mr. Smith seconded to approve the Plan as presented. Motion carried with no objections.

Discussion and possible action on allowing tree culling in/on County property – Mr. Brault provided background on the issue, explaining that Mr. Brian Nieme had inquired about cutting down trees himself that he considered to be a hazard on Sheboygan County-owned property at the Gerber Lake Wildlife Area. Mr. Brault stated that the trees were blown over and the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances does not explicitly allow for a private individual to cut down trees on County-owned property. Ms. Pipping stated that allowing Mr. Nieme to cut the trees, of which there are two, could set a precedence that the public can cut down trees on

County-owned property. Mr. Brault stated that the snowmobile clubs agreed that the trees were not a danger to snowmobilers. Mr. Brault explained that the County would not be liable if an individual were to be injured during a walk and a tree fell on him or her because it holds recreational immunity. Supervisor Epping motioned and Ms. Pipping seconded to have Mr. Brault request PRAECOM to allow him to have the County Transportation Department cut down and remove the trees. Motion carried with a vote of 5-4.

Discussion and possible action of Stewardship Committee composition – Mr. Brault distributed a spreadsheet of the current composition of the Stewardship Advisory Committee (SAC) and his proposed composition of SAC members. He offered two suggestions to the Committee: re-configure the current SAC make-up to his suggestion as outlined on the spreadsheet, or dissolve the current SAC and have Stewardship application recommendations become a responsibility of the SCRFMAC. The Committee asked Mr. Brault what the SAC would prefer. Mr. Brault stated that it is sometimes difficult to achieve a quorum at SAC meetings, and that he would discuss the options with the SAC at its next meeting in June. Mr. Holden moved and Ms. Pipping seconded to dissolve the SAC and for the SCRFMAC take Stewardship application recommendations as part of its responsibilities. Motion carried with no objections.

**Update on Friends of the Marsh new building efforts** – Ms. Pipping provided an update, stating that the Friends of the Marsh had a booth at Kohler Company's Earth Day event and that the group has met with contractors. She explained that Jos. Schmitt had been chosen as the contractor for construction of the new building.


Other Departmental Updates – Mr. Brault gave an update on the new structure of PRAECOM, explaining which new County Board supervisors were voted to it and in what capacities.







Most of the "activities" above can already be done in the Gerber Lake Wildlife Area. Sports people have helped make the purchase of much of the surrounding land a reality to the tune of \$100,000+ through the Sheboygan County Conservation Assoc., and now many of those members have to pay a fee to launch a watercraft there.

The group camp activity is the only thing not already available, and that is the one thing that would bring larger numbers of people to the area at the same time, which would infringe on the "wilderness setting" that makes this area so unique in the county. Sometimes a natural area needs no "improvement"!

I don't use it and probably won't ever use it!



Improve the camping areas, Better Bathrooms would help. Improved sites.

More hiking, improved trails.

Outdoor dining at restaurant would be great

Fix up camp sites & better bathroom.

Renovate the bathrooms, keep them clean, lower camping fees

This is a great recreational location in the County, please keep it "as is".

It would be nice to have maps of trails in and around the marsh available to visitors. When I asked at the restaurant this summer, they didn't know of any.

Also, I have friends from out-of-state who'd like to use the campground, but don't because of the lack of shower facilities. In fact, even though we live so close, we've never camped there either for that reason, and we've camped (tent and popup) all over Wisconsin for 40-plus years. Otherwise the camping area is really nice.

Keep the yearly campers. This is guarenteed income. It is stupid to kick these people out.

Also, why does the county have to take such a big cut of the profites from the resturant/bar.

Drain the marsh to limit expense in cattail management. Don't use boat landing funds for any new activities not directly related to the landing.

clean up around the permanent campers, they have too much junk in plain sight. I thought that this was a camp ground, not a junk yard. Get rid of the permanent campers and let first come first serve to those sights with no longer than a month to camp in one spot. Jack up those permanent rates and make this a public camp ground again. It has gotten to be an eye sore.

Get rid of the permanent tailers parked south of the restaurant.

Continue to support fishing which is available to the public regardless of age and income. It is very enjoyable and can be done from shore which is rare in Sheboygan County.

I know that there was a fish die-off this past harsh winter, and most likely another one after this upcoming winter. It would be great to continue having fish stocked in the marsh to keep it a viable and fruitful fishing hole each year.

Remove the permanent campers sites with all there lights and deck, storage shed etc.

Making the Marsh itself more accessible to people for fishing and duck hunting. Opening up the channels somehow and reducing the amount of weeds that keep most outboard motors from going out on it.

This kind of facility is not a needed function for county govt.

Remove permanent trailers.

Better boat pier

The pit toilets in the campground are disgusting, run down and in dire need of repair or replacement. The partitions in the women's toilet are rusted and falling down. The showers in the old lodge are equally disgusting. The caretakers of the campground don't seem to care about maintenance of the campgrounds as we have brought these things up in the past and nothing has been corrected. Please get these things taken care of to make our camping experience more enjoyable.

Better maintenance given by the people in charge of the park, be it the county or the restaurant and park caretakers.

Better care of restrooms, and a little more respect for the permanent campers that provide guaranteed revenue to the park on a yearly basis.

Better maintenance of the boat launch. The launch area was rebuild very nicely after the last draw down, but it has been destroyed by the ice over the winter. The wooden parts should be removable at the end of the season (after duck and deer hunting). Also a wash-down station (simple hose run from the marsh water) to get all the weeds off the boats and trailers to comply with the invasive species laws would be nice.

I like taking photos and would love to see a trail system comparable to what they have at Horicon, or Antigo's Springbrook trails to make things more accessable for the older generation, or handicapped group where they could also be more in touch with nature and let them also enjoy taking photos and seeing the sights.

My second idea would be to have a camera that would stream a video to the assisted care, or nursing homes in the area for those people that are no longer able to enjoy the outdoors but still in their hearts would love to be out there.

Open the old lodge up again as rentable space for private events. Fix up the existing garage, and NOT build a new fancy building.

I haven't spent enough time at the park to suggest anything, however I feel the park is fine as is!

More educational facilities for youth especially those in urban areas - that don't get the opportunity to experience the outdoors and nature.

Cut the cost to the taxpayer.

It is a unique area in Sheboygan County and it should be maintained and improved where ever possible for everyone's enjoyment.

Too busy working to utilize the facilities.

4 wheeler make a mess of the channels. They break through and water flows into the snow. In turn it freezes into bad ruts. Snowmobiles should be on a side of the channel and 4 wheelers on the other side of the channels, snowmobiles don't cause ruts.

I have never seen the Marsh Lodge or campground this active. The business is running very well. It's a fun place to visit. Remove \$4 fee to launch boats. Several of us drive, so a pass isn't feasible. Definitely has negatively impaced use of Marsh.

Warming hut/area for winter activities.

I would like to see seasonal camping discontinued and temporary camping promoted more. More trails and access through the Marsh area would increase visitation and awareness of the Marsh resources.

Please consider making the Marsh fishing available to kids only. Everytime fish are planted, they do not have a chance to spawn. The paper publizied it and all the retirees and many middle aged people fish it out in a month or so.

My family hasn't utilized the Marsh much yet. However, I hear great things about it. People enjoy it a lot.

A nature trail for wildlife viewing/hiking/snowshoeing (in winter).

Improve fishing. Get rid of odor by dam. More water huckups.

Keep it wild. Need more advertising.

When they haul the cattail bogs past my house on MM live on corner take walks all over the road and on my corner chunks have to drive over/when dry all tails fly on lawn - they could do better job what a mess. Hanging over truck falling all over. Discussing sloppy.

Public archery range. Better fishing, i.e. deeper water in some areas.

Bait shop - al above - maybe even just a cooler with worms and grubs at least. You already have staff and facility.

It is a great area and would like to see it enhanced yet maintain a lot of the familiar sights and amenities currently offered. Take better care of your boat launch and make it better Keep it clear of cattails you make people pay to use the boat launch now so make it better and take care of it.

More water outlets throughout the north campground area. Most water oses don't reach to the center faucet. Cleaer and better smelling bathrooms.

Tower is very nice. Restrooms showers need improvement. Rent out airboats, canoes, kayaks. User fees must be added - camper fees raised? To support leisure activities - don't raise our taxes!

Cabin rental - great idea. Safe archery sight in range w/ tower. Move restaurant kitchen away from bar (poor design) and enlarge the kitchen. Stock croppies.

Speed bumps on NR to improve safety/slow cars down as they pass campground.

When did our beautiful historic picnic areas turn into group camping? Should have had public input/hearings on this. Is this legal? State regulations require certain distances to water and restrooms and how many campers are allowed as per permit. Are there any rules for annual (perm.) campers? They seem to be able to do or build anthing on their site. Looks very trashy for a public park. Guidelines are rules need to be developed and enforced. Why not even consider picnic areas as a use? Was one a busy area for family reunions. Now no tables and a fee charged to picnic. Why? Keep campers out of picnic areas. Don't allow camper to move fire rings - makes a mess. Stick fish on an annual basis. Trails for hiking/birding would be nice. No trails marked or maintained (need to create some). Some campers are allowed to camp fro weeks and months outside the campground areas ruining picnic areas for other users. Been attacked by unleashed pets from campers in picnic area. Fire ring rolled around creates burnt out turf areas all over. Discontinue making people pay a fee to use the picnic area. Bring back picnic tables. None there now except for campers illegally using the picnic area to camp.

A nicer dock/launch for boats and watercraft.

I have heard of Sheboygan Marsh but had no idea that there was camping there. I always assumed it was open land for waterfowl hunting. We will have to check out the campground sometime soon.

Bike trails

Boat landing needs to be replaced.

Keep boat landing area clear of floating debris.

Support termination of permanent campsites.

Nicer boat landings. There are lots of northern pike and large mouth bass in the Marsh and most people do not know it. Fishing can be great in the Marsh. The hunting is fantastic too. Deer and ducks.

Publish a booklet that identifies the various birds and wildlife that inhabit the Marsh. Better boat launches,

Guided boat tours of the Marsh in summer for the public.

Paved parking lot at tower and boat launch. Continue 5-6 year draw down of the Marsh to prevent cattail bogs from clogging the dam.

I believe it is a great place for people to bond with nature. Maybe more biking/hiking trails if possible.

Sometimes it feels like one is invading a private campground rather than a county park. For many it is their summer home and I don't really want to be subsidizing that. I'm glad however it gets used.

Enhance for County residence if you make camp more attractive out of state and other county residence building new skill center is good.

A better boat launch would be nice. It kinda harry. We really enjoy the tower and take our out of state friends there to climb it when they visit

Plan on trying the restaurant haven't for a long time

Never used Marsh other than restaurant once or twice.

Expand access to areas beyond the tower with walking or biking paths.

Keep up the good work!

Consider boardwalk hikes - south ditch and north ditch. Improve maintain fishing docks. Improve camping - promote more hikers/bicycle camping opportunities. Outsite seating for restaurant/bar.

Have DNR stop draining it dredge it properly once instead

Boat launch. When launching boat have to walk on thin seament rail. Older people have falling in. I seen it. One side good. Other side not. Thank you.

Remove permanent campsites. Select a committee from county conservation groups to manage the Marsh Park, remove the DNR from the management position. Develop a way to stop draining the marsh to protect the aquatic life, fish, waterfowl, and wildlife. Each time the marsh is drained it ages teh watershed with more cattail growth: DNR airboats should be restricted from using the marsh if the law dictated they are prohibited.
