Sheriff's Department

Sheboygan County Sheriff's Office Captain Cory Roeseler, Health and Human Services Director Tom Eggebrecht and Sheboygan Police Department Captain Steve Cobb informed the Committee members about the Crisis Intervention Training Grant. The grant cap, if awarded, would be \$50,000 which would not cover all the costs involved. The Health and Human Services Committee has approved the carryover of funds into 2015 from the 2014 Health and Human Services positive variance in the amount of \$30,000 to support the Crisis Intervention Training Initiative and has forwarded this request to the Finance Committee for consideration. The Law Committee supports the Crisis Intervention Training Grant and the carryover of \$30,000 for the Crisis Intervention Training.

The Law Committee supports out-of-state travel to Huron County, MI to view/discuss their radio system. The cost for the out-of-state travel is included with the Radio System Replacement/Upgrade project.

CHILD SUPPORT QUARTERLY REPORT

December 31, 2014

- 1. Attend child support staff and management meetings as available to explain new policy and processes, as well as overall agency operation and circuit court appearances.
- 2. Lien Docket as of December 31, 2014:

2014 Lien total 1,880 Cases

The lien-eligibility threshold is set at \$500. Sheboygan County has approximately 1830 cases which are eligible for liens. The following is a listing of other administrative enforcement tools which are automated through the lien docket per the D134 Report, dated September 30, 2014:

54 liens in limited enforcement	\$	264,664

1612 cases eligible for Account Seizure

Staff are keeping up with various reports as most enforcement actions are automatic unless a payment plan is established.

3. As of December 31, 2014, our monthly performance targets and current standings are as follows:

4. The 2015 budget for Child Support is being developed. The Child Support Department was again given \$0 in tax levy for 2015. The State is working on the funding we will have for 2015.

We received word at the end of June that the CY2015 Actual Funding Allocation Earned with Actual Incentives for Sheboygan County will be approximately \$679,649.00. At this time, I would recommend that we continue using the \$679,649.00 as the State has not provided a final amount and may not until the Spring of 2015.

 The Private Fee Ordinance was approved at the October meeting of the County Board. We implemented this process April 1, 2013. This fee was included in our 2013 and 2015 Budgets.

At the present time, it appears that this is not working as it does in other counties, as we must give each of our private cases one free service per the Judges and Corporation Counsel. We then charge the parties for the second request for service. We have sent out 19 invoices for payment and received four \$35 payments this quarter. In this first year, there was a total of 136 cases that were sent informative letters and applications for service. This effort has resulted in 10 applications for service. There were 25 invoices sent out requesting payment of which 22 have made a \$35 payment for revenue of \$770.00 and leaving an unpaid balance of \$105.00 for this year.

We will be reviewing these private fees during 2015 and determine if it is beneficial to us or not. We will keep you informed.

6. Call Center Progress

The average number of calls that were handled by the Call Center for the first year of operation was 1,110 per month. The talk time has stayed close to 3 1/2 minutes and the hold time has gone down to 1 minute from a high of almost 3 minutes in January, 2014. The Call Center staff are able to answer questions concerning payments and general information but are not trained child support specialists; therefore, case specific information is referred to the child support specialist who can research an answer for the Call Center staff to convey to the caller. The supervisors at the Call Center have been responsive to queries about how calls were handled and have corrected problems as they have been reported. Those child support staff members who were not able to visit the Call Center in August, 2014 will be visiting the Call Center in February, 2015 to see how it works for themselves and get a more thorough understanding of the logistics of the Call Center operation.

7. Sheboygan County Child Support will be working with the State to implement the LEAN program during 2015. The State will train staff to be facilitators in this program.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. _____ (2014/15)

Re: Amending Chapter 90 - Citation Enforcement

WHEREAS, Chapter 90 of the County Code provides for a method of enforcement of County ordinances through the issuance of citations rather than through the more cumbersome and expensive process of issuing summonses and complaints, and

WHEREAS, changes to the statutes governing the use of citations require an updating of Chapter 90 to continue in compliance with state requirements, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of Sheboygan County to update our Code provisions to be in conformity with state law;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Amending Chapter 90</u>. Chapter 90 of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows (additions indicated by redlining, deletions by strikeouts):

CHAPTER 90 LAWCITATION ENFORCEMENT

- 90.01 CITATIONS FOR COUNTY ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS. Except as otherwise specifically provided in this Code, the statutory provisions of Wis. Stat. § 66.11966.0113 describing and defining procedure with respect to violations of these Ordinances, are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this Code as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated herein by reference is required or prohibited by this Code. Any further amendments, revisions, or modifications of the statutes incorporated herein are intended to be made a part of this Code in order to secure uniform state-wide regulation of the procedure as to citations for certain ordinance violations.
- 90.02 ADOPTION OF FORM MSC 1 CITATION. The A form captioned "Wisconsin Sheboygan County Uniform Municipal Citation" (in compliance with the provisions of Wis. Stat. § 66.11966.0113) as approved by the Sheriff and Corporation Counsel is hereby adopted as hereinafter set forthfor use to enforce Sheboygan County ordinance violations. Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of this form done by the County of Sheboygan is intended to be made a part of this Code in order to secure uniform county-wide administration of citations for certain ordinance violations. Only such provisions of personally identified information by this form that are reasonably related to the enforcement to the ordinance shall be completed by the issuing officer or official. If applicable, the uniform traffic citation developed under Wis. Stat. § 345.11 or the Natural Resources citation developed under Wis. Stat. § 23.54 may be used instead. Filing of the form with the County Clerk shouldshall serve as the recognition of that form as the form approved by this Section.

- 90.03 STIPULATION OF GUILT OR NO CONTEST. Stipulations of "Guilty" or "No Contest" may be made by persons to whom a citation has been issued for violation of an ordinance. Stipulations shall conform to the form contained in Wis. Stat. § 66.19(3)66.0113. It may be accepted within ten (10) days of the date of the alleged violation. Stipulations may be accepted by the Clerk of Courts of Sheboygan County, Wisconsin.
- 90.04 DEPOSIT. Any person stipulating "Guilty" or "No Contest" under Subsection 90.03 of this Code must make the deposit required under Wis. Stat. § 66.19(3)66.0113 as determined under Subsection 90.05 of this Code. Deposits may be brought or mailed to the Clerk of Courts' Office of Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, as directed by the arresting officer or official. If a citation is issued at a time when the Clerk of Courts' Office is not open, the cash deposits may be accepted at a stationary law enforcement office where a receipt can be issued. Receipts shall be given for all cash deposits.
- 90.05 BOND AND DEPOSIT SCHEDULE. The cash deposits herein referred to, together with the taxable costs and disbursements and the levy of the penalty assessment surcharges where applicable according to Wis. Stat. § 165.87 shall be set forth in a "Bond Schedule" and shall be filed with the Clerk of Circuit Courts and thereupon is made a part of this Ordinance by reference.
 - (1) The cash deposit amounts on said "Bond Schedule" shall be determined by a majority of the Circuit Judges for Sheboygan County, and where no specific amount is so set by said Judges, then the State of Wisconsin Revised Uniform State Traffic Deposit Schedule and related schedulesor Alcohol-Beverages,

Harassment and Safety Violations Deposit Schedule, or Uniform Misdemeanor Bail-Schedule, or Trespass to Land Deposit-Schedule or the Revised Uniform Deposit and Bail Schedule for Conservation, Environmental Protection, Boating, Snowmobile, ATV, UTV, and Captive Wildlife Violations in existence at the time of the violation shall be utilized, and in the absence of any schedule or applicable amount, the bond shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) plus the penalty assessment, and court costs.

- (2)The deposits or forfeited penalties under this Chapter shall be delivered to the Sheboygan County Clerk of Courts as soon as practical.
- 90.06 ISSUANCE OF CITATIONS. As authorized by Wis. Stat. § 66.119(2)66.0113(2) any County law enforcement officer may issue the citations authorized by this Chapter. In addition, those persons who are correctional supervisors of the jail or who hold the position of Planning and Conservation Director or the Director's designee or Check Fraud Investigator may issue citations with respect to Ordinances which are directly related to their official responsibilities. In addition, unless otherwise provided for in this Code, the Sheriff may designate County officials who shall be authorized to issue citations with respect to County ordinances which are directly related to the official responsibilities of those officials.

Section 2. **Effective Date**. The herein Ordinance shall take effect upon enactment.
