Chairman Abler called the meeting to order at 10:01 AM. Michelle Sifuentes certified compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting notice was posted on Friday March 20, 2026 at 4:00 PM.

There was no correspondence to present to the Committee.

Supervisor Goehring made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 26 Executive Committee Meeting and March 11 Executive Committee Special Meeting. Motion seconded by Supervisor Procek. Motion carried.

The Committee discussed the Wetland Mitigation Bank Credit Sale. Planning and Conservation Deputy Director Tyler Betry gave an overview and answered questions. Supervisor Procek made a motion to approve the credit sale as presented. Motion seconded by Supervisor Goehring. Motion carried.

The Committee discussed Amendments to County Code – Chapter 2. Corporation Counsel Crystal Fieber and Human Resources Director Dave Loomis gave an overview and answered questions. Supervisor Brauer made a motion to approve the amendments as presented in section 2.09. Motion seconded by Supervisor Procek. Motion carried. Supervisor Procek made a motion to approve the amendments as presented in section 2.12. Motion seconded by Supervisor Goehring. Motion carried.

The Committee discussed Resolution No. 24 - Approving Amendment to Agreement Between Sheboygan County and the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents for the University of Wisconsin - Green Bay, Sheboygan Campus. Corporation Counsel Crystal Fieber gave an overview and answered questions. Supervisor Goehring made a motion to approve the resolution. Motion seconded by Supervisor Procek. Motion Carried.

The Committee discussed Resolution No. 25 - Approval of Changes to the Rural Functional Classification System in Sheboygan County. Transportation Director Bryan Olson gave an overview and answered questions. Supervisor Goehring made a motion to approve the resolution. Motion seconded by Supervisor Brauer. Motion Carried.

The Committee discussed Resolution No. 26 - Request for Sustainable Transportation Funding. Transportation Director Bryan Olson gave an overview and answered questions. Supervisor Procek made a motion to approve the resolution. Motion seconded by Supervisor Goehring. Motion

Carried.

County Administrator Alayne Krause began her report by noting that, due to severe weather, County buildings were closed on March 16 and non-essential employees were directed to remain home. She thanked all employees who had to report to work that day due to the nature of their jobs. Administrator Krause reported that Planning and Conservation Director Aaron Brault has secured over \$1 million in funding for the Sheboygan Marsh Boardwalk project and has submitted additional applications for Congressionally Directed Spending to help offset project costs. She shared that preliminary planning for the 2027 budget has begun, with involvement from herself, Deputy Administrator Emily Stewart, and Finance Director James Webb. Administrator Krause also discussed the upcoming County Board elections and the planned County Board reception. She noted that she has a forthcoming meeting with representatives from the City of Sheboygan and the Health and Human Services Department to discuss future funding for the Mobile Crisis Co-Response Unit. Administrator Krause further reported that Rocky Knoll is preparing for its Centennial Celebration, which will take place in September. Additionally, she informed the Committee of the announcement that State Senator Devin LeMahieu will not be seeking re-election. Lastly, Administrator Krause provided an update on pending state legislation that may impact the County, including matters related to Clerk of Courts funding, competitive bidding, and the Wisconsin utility tax.

There were no requests for approval of attendance at special meetings.

Vouchers were reviewed. Supervisor Goehring made a motion to approve the vouchers. Motion seconded by Supervisor Procek. Motion carried.
